# **Rider Category**

Open	Amateur	Junior
Open to all competitors, regardless of age or status. (Article E 3.4.1)	Open to competitors who hold amateur status issued by EC on their EC sport license card who are no longer Juniors under Article E 3.4.3 (except as outlined in Article E 3.4.2) and competitors who are not earning remuneration from teaching or training in the horse industry. ## **GENERAL RULES & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY**

**CURRENT DRESSAGE TESTS**: ALL dressage tests are available from www.equestrian.ca/sport/dressage/tests or www.fei.org for download

**DIRECTIONS & PARKING**: For arrival and departure of trailers and parking for competitors and visitors, see signage on-site.

**ENTRIES**: Only email entries will be accepted. All required memberships MUST be renewed before you submit your show entry form. Proof of negative Coggins and a signed waiver form MUST be submitted to the show manager along with your payment and entry form in order to validate your entries. For subsequent competitions in 2024, waivers will be kept on file. New waivers will only be required if a horse/rider combination changes.

Saskatoon Dressage Club accepts Western Dressage or Regina Dressage Club memberships in lieu of a Saskatoon Dressage Club membership, or memberships from dressage clubs based in other provinces (for competitors coming in from out of province). No competitor will be allowed to ride without the completed documentation. Failure to check in at the show office will result in elimination from the class or warm-up ride. No refunds will be given.

Entries will be processed on a first come, first served basis as the show is limited to 8 hours of judging per day.

**WAIVERS**: All entries must be accompanied by a Waiver of Liability duly signed and dated by the appropriate person (rider, owner, parent/guardian, and person responsible).

**COGGINS TEST**: Proof of a negative Coggins test within the last six months will be required for the 2024 competition season and MUST be submitted along with the entry form for your entry to be valid. No horse will be allowed on the competition grounds without prior proof of a negative result.

**CROSS-ENTERING**: More than one athlete may ride the same horse/pony at a competition providing the horse/pony is not entered by two athletes in the same class. The athletes can both be juniors or amateur/open or any mixture of these providing they are not in the same class unless the class is divided into separate categories for the purpose of ribbons. The horse/pony must not compete against itself.

**HORS CONCOURS ENTRIES**: A hors concours entry in a freestyle must have qualified to ride the freestyle. Hors concours entries are not eligible for any placings, prizes, or awards. A horse may compete as a hors concours and competitive entry at the same competition. Hors concours entries are not permitted in the Provincial Championship competition.

**LIMIT OF ENTRIES, TIME CHANGES, AND CLASS CANCELLATION**: The Show Manager for Saskatoon Dressage Club reserves the right to limit entries, limit tack stalls, combine or cancel classes, alter ring sizes, change designated rings, decide on any point not covered by the rules, and correct any errors or make any necessary changes to the prize list or program during the course of the competition year. Competitors will be notified at the earliest possible time of any changes. The onus will be upon the competitor to familiarize themselves with such changes. In the event of inclement weather, the Show Manager will do their best to reschedule classes. Should that not be possible, no refunds will be given for canceled classes.

**STABLING AND TACK STALLS**: Stabling fees will be charged per horse and stalls will be assigned. For the security of all competitors, DO NOT change your stall assignment without approval from the show office. Stalls must display emergency contact information for each horse (owner/person responsible/trainer, veterinarian). Stabling fees do not include the final cleaning of the stall and will not

include any shavings. Please pre-order your shavings on the entry form at a price of \$12 per bag (minimum order 2 bags). Additional shavings will be available for purchase – please see the show office. At the end of the competition, stalls must be stripped or will be charged a surcharge of \$50 per stall as per SDC rules. This extra cleaning fee will be invoiced after the competition. Failure to pay the extra cleaning fee will result in the competitor becoming a member not in good standing. Tack stalls are advised as new biosecurity rules prohibit storing hay or any equipment in the aisles.

**CANCELLATION**: Competitors canceling before the competition entry closing date will be refunded all fees minus the administration fee. Competitors canceling after the competition entry closing date, but before the start of the competition, will only be refunded their fees minus the administration fee upon receipt of a veterinarian's certificate for the horse or a doctor's certificate for the rider. Competitors canceling after the start of the competition will only be refunded fees for classes not ridden upon receipt of a veterinarian's certificate for the horse or a doctor's certificate for the rider. Documentation must reach the Show Manager within 14 days of the last day of the competition.

**REPORTING FOR COMPETITION**: All competitors MUST report to the show office upon arrival and before riding to confirm that all is in order with your paperwork and pay any fees owing. Failure to do so will result in elimination from either your warm-up ride or your class and no refunds will be given. For security reasons, we also need to know which horses are on the grounds and ensure that we have the correct contact information. The show office is open from 12 noon until after the last warm-up ride on Saturday, opens one hour before the competition starts on Monday, and remains open until the last ride of the day is completed. For those arriving Monday morning, please report to the show office as early as you can. Only one person at a time is allowed at the show office, other than a junior, who may be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

**NUMBERS**: Must be worn and visible at all times when any horse/pony is outside of its stall. This requirement includes familiarization horses. Numbers will not be available for purchase at the show office.

**SHOW SCHEDULE**: Warm-ups will be available starting at p.m. on Sunday. On Monday ring 2 is open to warm-up. Competitions generally start around 9:00 am and continue until completion of the classes based on entries. In the event of changes to the schedule, e.g., due to scratches, day sheets will be posted daily on the morning of competition. These sheets will inform all competitors of the most current and correct order of go and will override previous scheduling. It is the competitors' responsibility to check for any possible changes.

**SUBSTITUTION FEES**: There will be a \$10 fee for substituting a horse and/or rider competition entry after the entry closing date but before the competition has started. After the competition has started any changes to a rider or horse will be considered a new entry, a new number will be issued, and all appropriate fees must be paid. New entry forms and waivers must be signed, and memberships or temporary memberships must be in place.

**WARM-UP**: Horses may be schooled only in designated areas. Whips, running martingales, boots, and bandages are allowed for schooling only. Only mounted riders are allowed in the warm-up rings. Horses may only be ridden in the competition rings on Sunday provided a half-hour block of time has been purchased (see warm-up ride request form).

**LUNGING**: Lunging is not permitted in an area where horses are being ridden. Lunging (unmounted) and work in hand can only be done by the rider, owner, coach, groom, or person responsible. It is not permitted to lunge riders at any competition, whether or not the horse is entered in the competition. Lunging is permitted only in designated areas if space permits.

Please speak with the show manager about options for lunging.

**CONFLICT OF INTEREST**: It is the responsibility of the rider not to enter a class or ride in front of a judge from whom he/she has been instructed, coached, or tutored with or without pay the 30 days immediately prior to the date of the competition.

**CALLERS**: A caller for tests will not be provided. Competitors should therefore make their own arrangements. Caller's dress code: smart casual; jeans, slacks, and mid-length shorts are permitted. Inappropriately dressed callers may not be allowed to call a test; tank tops and short shorts are prohibited. Callers may not wear personal electronic devices, e.g., Bluetooth, headphones, etc. while calling tests except for the exceptions listed in Section E Article 9.1.5.

**SAFETY HEADGEAR**: All riders, regardless of age or level of competition, must wear properly fitted and fastened safety approved protective headgear at all times when mounted.

**LIABILITY**: It is a condition of entry that neither Saskatoon Dressage Club, Saskatchewan Horse Federation, Equestrian Canada and any of their officials, volunteers, officers, directors, agents, representatives, employees, and the owners and occupiers of the land upon which these competitions are held will be responsible for any liabilities or claims of any nature and kind which may arise from participation in these events. Waivers must be signed by the competitor, person responsible, and their parent/guardian (in the case of a junior), as well as the horses' legal owner before the start of the competition.

**DOGS**: Dogs are discouraged. They are not permitted near riding areas. These are the only animals, other than horses or ponies, permitted on the competition grounds. They must be under control, quiet, and <u>on a leash</u> (no expanding leashes) at all times. <u>Due to new bio security rules, dogs are NOT allowed</u> in any of the buildings at the facility. Please pick up after your dog.

**NO PHONE, FAX, OR MAIL ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED**: All entry forms, Coggins tests, and signed waivers MUST be received by midnight of the closing date. Please print, complete, and email your entry form(s). Payment can then be made by e-Transfer (no cheques accepted). Late entries may be accepted for a late entry fee of \$25 and only if space permits and the late entry can be accommodated within the time parameters of scheduling.

**PAYMENT**: All entries must be accompanied by a payment of the appropriate fees by e-Transfer for your entry to be valid.

#### PRIZES AND AWARDS

Ribbons are awarded to third place. Any horse receiving less than 40% of the total points obtainable in a test will be eliminated from that class. Any horse receiving less than 50% of the total points obtainable in a test shall not be eligible for awards, ribbons, or prizes.

When there is only one horse in a class, ribbons and prizes shall be awarded in accordance with the following chart of percentages:

- 1st......63% or higher
- 2nd ......60% to 62.9%
- 3rd ...... 58% to 59.9%
- No ribbons or prizes shall be awarded below 3rd position

All competition ribbons for classes can be picked up with tests throughout the day at the show office. Division Championships are based on the highest average of two tests within a division. Riders must have a valid PSO and SDC/RDDA membership to qualify for the show division championship.

**Thoroughbred Incentive Program**: An award will be presented to the shows High Point Thoroughbred registered in the TIP. TIP number must be included on the entry form.
